This week, our school came together to celebrate **Internet Safety Day 2025**, a vital occasion to raise awareness about keeping our children safe online. The theme this year was 'Too good to be true? Protecting yourself and others from scams online'.

Here are our top internet safety tips:

- 1. **Think Before You Click:** Always pause and think before clicking on a link or downloading an app. Make sure it's from a trusted source.
- 2. Never Share Personal Information: It's important to keep private details like your full name, address, and school information safe from strangers online.
- 3. **Be Kind Online:** Just like in person, kindness matters online. Treat others with respect and report any bullying or harmful behavior.
- 4. Use Strong Passwords: Create unique passwords and change them regularly. Avoid using easily guessable information, like your name or birthday.
- 5. **Tell an Adult if Something Feels Wrong:** If you see something online that makes you uncomfortable or unsure, always talk to a trusted adult.
